



## THE REPORTER

As we prepare to enter Lent on February 14, these words from the prophet Joel are appropriate.

*“Yet even now,” declares the LORD,  
“return to Me with all your heart,  
With fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;  
And rend your hearts and not your garments.”  
Return to the LORD your God,  
For He is gracious and merciful,  
Slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love;  
And He relents over disaster.  
(Joel 2:12-13)*

Not just in Lent, but at all times, God sends out the call to return to Him in repentance and humility. We are tempted to live our lives as if God and our faith only matter on Sunday morning. And even then, we are tempted that only the hour of worship time is truly important to God and for our faith.

Throughout the midweek services in Lent, we will focus our minds on the importance of our faith in every moment of our lives. Not one moment of time has not been redeemed by Jesus on His cross. Our Lent series is called *Guided to the Cross*. Throughout the series, we will see God’s continual invitation throughout every day of our lives to return to Him, to kneel at the cross, and to live a God-pleasing life.

Our Christian faith revolves around the cross. It is both sorrowful, because of the sacrifice Jesus makes there, and joyous, because our salvation is secured there. We come to the cross with fasting, weeping and mourning over our sin. We come to the cross because God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. We come to the cross because He relents over the disaster our sin deserves, giving us forgiveness of all our sins.

There is no more important moment of time than our Lord’s crucifixion. There is no greater moment to reflect upon and to build our lives upon. We go through Lent remembering what we will sing on Easter morning: “It was a strange and dreadful strife when life and death contended; the victory remained with life, the reign of death was ended. Holy Scripture plainly saith that death is swallowed up by death, its sting is lost forever. Alleluia!” (LSB #458.4)

We return to God with all our hearts, rending our hearts before Him so that He might show His gracious mercy and abounding steadfast love.

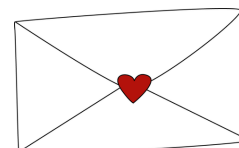
