




#### Thanksgiving for Light



## Passion Reading - Gethsemane

When they had sung a hymn, He went out, as was His custom, to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed Him. But Peter said more vehemently, "If I have to die with You, I will never deny You." And all the others said likewise.






Jesus said to him, "Friend, why have you come? Judas, do you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?"
