Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. (Revelation 14:13)

Many people pre-arrange their funerals with the funeral home, making sure that all of the items necessary for the funeral home are taken care of so that their loved ones don't have to stress over these decisions in their grief. Why not also pre-arrange the worship service so that your loved ones don't have to stress over Scripture readings and hymns?

The Funeral Service is a public confession of our faith concerning death, burial, resurrection, and the life everlasting. In this service, the baptismal theme of death and resurrection with Christ is most prominent. The sermon allows the pastor a unique opportunity to proclaim Law and Gospel to many hearers who may not know the true source of Christian comfort in our sorrow and grief. The proclamation of Christ crucified and resurrected specifically for the deceased and their loved ones.

I am offering two Funeral Planning events this month: Monday, June 16 at 7pm, and Thursday, June 19 at 2pm. We will take a look at our Funeral rite in the hymnal and see how the Scriptures and hymns shape the service.

There will be Funeral Planning Sheets to fill out. On top of the listing of pallbearers and desired memorials, you have the opportunity to include your Confirmation verse (often the sermon text) and favorite Bible passages, psalms, and hymns. You can keep a copy for your records so that your loved ones know your wishes and leave a copy for the church office for our records.

The whole notion of planning your funeral service seems depressing, but it allows you the opportunity to voice for certain what you want your funeral service to confess. These events will also allow for questions about what is appropriate for a Christian funeral service. This includes making sure that the hymns sung during the service are not ambiguous or not in line with the Christian faith being expressed in the service.

So teach us to numbers our days that we may get a heart of wisdom. (Psalm 90:12)

None of us knows when our last day on earth will be. We have seen funerals for stillbirths, for those over one hundred years old, and everywhere in between. Death doesn't wait for us to be ready or ask our permission. Death comes when our allotted days on earth are through.

Offering and Offertory

What is the purpose of the Offertory around the Offering in the service? The Offertory is a sung prayer, asking God to bless the physical offerings that are gathered. The Offertory quotes Psalm 116:12-19 in Divine Service Setting 1 and Psalm 51:10-12 in Divine Service Setting 3. The Offertory also serves as a bridge between the physical blessings, of which we have given a token of what God has given us, and the spiritual blessings that are to be received in the Lord's Supper. We look forward to taking the "cup of salvation" (Psalm 116:13) through which Jesus creates "a clean heart" and renews a "right spirit" in us (Psalm 51:10).
