For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. (Galatians 5:1)

When we think of freedom, we think of deliverance from oppression. We enjoy our political freedom. Freedom which cannot always be stated clearly. Freedom which is regularly questioned.

When Christ set us free, there is no question to our freedom. "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36). But what has Christ set us free from? He has set us free from our slavery to sin. "Everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin" (John 8:34).

As St. Paul continues in his epistle to the Galatians, he contrasts the works of the flesh with the fruit of the Spirit. "They are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do" (Galatians 5:17).

We often think that freedom allows us to do whatever we want, but Christians do not have that privilege. We are freed to follow after Christ's example. "Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Galatians 5:24). As he also writes, "I am crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Galatians 2:20).

We live in the freedom to imitate our Savior: "through love serve one another" (Galatians 5:13). He did not come down to establish an earthly kingdom. He came "to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). He saves by serving through love. His love and service is seen through the call to freedom that echoes from His cross. There, He took away all the guilt of your sin. There, He set you free. From there, He strengthens you to stand against the yoke of slavery the devil, the world, and your sinful nature wishes to put you under again.

We live in freedom because we live in the Spirit. The Spirit who "calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith." All of the Spirit's work is to help us to stand firm in the freedom we have in the Gospel. The Gospel that has been proclaimed around the world for nearly two thousand years. The Gospel of loving service through the One who died and rose again to give us the ultimate freedom. Freedom to live with Him forever in Heaven.

- \$2,600 for Parking lot closure devices and camera installation, Immanuel Lutheran Student Center, Macomb
- \$6,000 to Refurbish seating in library and game room and technology in game room, Immanuel Lutheran Student Center, Macomb
