1 Cor. 2:8: They have crucified the Lord of glory.

And Acts 20:28: We are purchased with God's blood.

Freedom always comes at a price. "For freedom Christ has set us free" (Galatians 5:1). "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

Our Christian freedom came at the price of Christ's holy blood shed for us on the cross. He suffered for us because He is truly man. His suffering covers everyone because He is truly God. He must be both God and man or He cannot be a Savior and Redeemer. He must be both to reconcile us with the Father.

This month's readings from the Formula of Concord remind us of the great calamity of faith and hope that results when we do not understand the two natures of Christ properly. Without His humanity, He cannot suffer and die. Without His divinity, He cannot save the whole world.

Being truly God and truly man, Jesus is able to be our High Priest. He is able to be the crucified Lord of glory. He is able to purchase you with His holy and divine blood. Since you are His, you are free. "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36).

Freedom is a wonderful blessing that the Son gives to us in His Means of Grace. Through these, He points you back to His life, death and resurrection for the forgiveness of your sins, for your salvation, and for life everlasting. The crucified and risen Lord of glory frees you through the Word and Sacraments that are received from His own hand.

This month, we begin our Christian Education time together again. Another year of opportunity to learn from God's Word the great blessings He has given us through His Son. Our Adult Bible Class will take up Luther's Large Catechism, as we seek to "remain a child and pupil of the catechism" like Luther himself (LC Preface 8).

Join us as we journey through this basic confessional doctrine of our congregation that we might together grow in our faith and further celebrate the freedom that has been purchased for us by Christ.


